

**WORSHIP:**

Regular participation in corporate worship and willingness to occasionally share in its leadership in areas of liturgy, music, planning, readings, etc.

**Personal Spiritual Growth:**

Participation in adult study groups. Engage in personal study of the Bible and faith. Discipline of personal prayer, reading Bible, contemplation.

**Corporate Mission:**

Help develop and support the corporate actions of the church as it responds to issues and acts to effect God's purpose in the world.

**Family Life Style:**

Time spent with the family in developing a life style which is a living witness to how a Christian family should relate to faith & world.

**Evangelism & Visitation:**

By word and action being willing to share the discovery of good news in your life and participate in visiting with members and non-members.

**Personal Mission:**

Serving as a volunteer in the community or being willing to speak out in support of actions which will help make this a better world for all of God's children.

**Community Building:**

Taking time to become acquainted with the individual members of the church and working to create a sense of belonging and support among members.

**Teaching:**

Sharing in the teaching ministry of the church through participation in the Sunday school program, youth groups, adult studies, or training.

**Stewardship:** Willingness to support through giving of time and money the corporate expression of the faith as expressed through the operations and functions of my church.

**Denominational & ecumenical:**

Willing to contribute my time and talent by serving on denominational boards and committees; working for ecumenical co-operation and joint actions.

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# The Spiritual Leadership Game



**INSTRUCTIONS:**

1. Using the stickers supplied, identify in order of preference, those functions and callings which best describe your spiritual leadership in the church. You may discard up to three stickers which do not describe you in a significant way (place these in box numbers 8, 9, 10).

Beginning with your top choice, add a plus sign (“+”) to those you are MOST sure about and which you feel describe you best.

2. When time is called, gather with your small group and share your choices. Tell why you chose the top selections. Indicate which you discarded.

3. When you have finished sharing your choices, ask the group these questions:

- Do you agree that these choices describe me accurately?
- In what ways have you seen me in these roles I’ve picked for myself?
- Are there other areas which I have not chosen that you would pick as relevant to me?

4. When you are ready, ask the next person to share.
